I participated in MG106: Strategic Management, which was held during session 3 at LSE Summer School. I can proudly say this experience was a life changing. We had a 3 hours-lecture and a 90 minutes-class from Monday to Friday and deepened our understanding of firms' decision-making processes. The lecture included contents like industry analysis using Porter's Five Force, followed by business model analysis, competitive advantage analysis, and strategy implementation using methods like Value Curve, Value Net, and Game Theory.
